

Terrific Two's Back to School News

Welcome to another school year here at SHECC! We are so happy to have you here with us! We are going to start the school year off with learning the classroom basics. We will spend the next month and a half learning about classroom rules, manners, and feelings. The children have done well so far with learning how "Center Play" works. We are teaching the children to keep the toys in their designated "center" and to clean up what they were playing with before they move on to a new center. We will also be adding personal tags with each child's name and photo that they will attach to the center label of the center they are playing in. This will help control how many children are in one center at a time to allow them more personal space to play and learn. We have also started to implement The Pyramid Model for promoting social-emotional competence in infants and young children. We all received extensive training on this model, and it is being implemented across the entire school. This means as your child continues to move up the same concepts, verbiage, and tools will be used in every room they transition to. We have already established a solution center in our room. That is where we keep our soft snuggle toys, and our Friend Tucker the Turtle is there too. We also have a flower for sniffing and a pinwheel for blowing to help teach how to take deep calming breaths. The solution center will be used for the children to have their own space to safely identify and manage their emotions and learn how to handle difficult situations in an acceptable manner.

We will soon be introducing the "Character Kids" as well. They are a group of kids who have special powers that they use to do good things that every kid should. Their names are Brandy and she is cooperative, Scooter is kind, Alex is brave, Ricky is honest, and Keisha is responsible. If you have any questions about any of these new tools, let me know and I would be happy to show them to you.



Several of you have asked if there is anything we need so I plan to post a wish list on our door soon for some things we could use in our classroom and on our playground. We appreciate any and all donations made to our classroom.

Reminders:

- Please send back your child's "All About Me" form with photos attached.
- Please bring in a plain white t shirt in a Ziplock bag with your child's name on it for us to tie dye as soon as possible. We will start making them on Thursday August 1st when I return from my vacation. We will send the shirts home on Monday August 5th washed and ready to wear so we can all wear our shirts to school on Tuesday August 6th.
- Always check your child's basket and make sure they have at least two weather appropriate changes of clothes in a Ziplock bag with their name on it. We have also decided that we would like for you to keep a pair of crocs with your child's name on them in their basket. It is still going to be hot for a while and we may still do some water activities in the afternoons to stay cool. Having crocs would help keep their tennis shoes from possibly getting wet and muddy. They will also come in handy when we start wearing big girl/boy underpants because if we have accidents, we will have spare shoes available.
- We ask that each family donate two packs of wipes and a snack to share with the class each month. If you need ideas for what type of snacks to bring, I have a list I can provide you with.
- As stated in the parent handbook "Please make every effort to have your child in their classroom no later than 9:30 am. If you are not able to have your child in their classroom by 9:30am, please wait until after classroom nap time to bring them. Arriving during activities may be disruptive to the other children". Pre-School IA

August marks the beginning of the school year! New friends will be joining our class on August 12 and water play will be ending on August 8th.

We will be continuing our Classroom Orientation Unit until September 6th. This will give our new students a couple of weeks to learn the routine and structure of the class.

On August 26th, we will begin our “All About Me” Unit. In your child’s folder, you will find an “All About Me” paper. Please return it to me as soon as possible. These papers will be posted around the classroom. They are used to get to know your child and family better and to promote conversation with the children about their families. During this unit, the children will also be working on many self-help skills such as proper handwashing techniques, putting on their own shoes and pulling up and down their pants.

September 9th will mark the beginning of the “Apples and Our Five Senses Unit”. Each week, we will use a different sense to explore apples. We will be taste lots of different apple products, make applesauce, paint with apples, roll apples, graph our preference of which apple type we like the best and the list of apple related activities goes on and on. The Unit will culminate with an Apple Party on Friday, October 11th at 3:30pm. Due to limited space in our classroom, only one family member is invited to come and share a variety of apple snacks and songs with us.

We have many of these “End of Unit Celebrations” throughout the year, so all family members will have a chance to attend at least one.

Developing fine motor strength and coordination is a very important emphasis during this school year. Making apples by tearing red paper and gluing it to a paper plate and sorting apple counters with tweezers are just a couple of activities which will exercise these skills.

I firmly believe that communication between families and school is extremely important. It enables me to better meet the needs of your child and you might have.

PRE-SCHOOL IB

Welcome to SHECC for another fun filled year. As we move forward from the summer months the children will begin learning more about our center system and working on remembering to clean up their toys before moving to a new area. The children will be encouraged to use their new vocabulary from our Character Kids story. The Characters are Brandy who is cooperative, Skooter is kind, Alex is brave, Ricky is honest, and Keisha is responsible. Each week we will be introducing one character at a time, I will be sending home a handout about each character and their ‘superpower’ this way while at home with your child you can be reinforcing the same vocabulary your child is learning at school. Another concept that we will be focusing on throughout the year is The Pyramid Model for promoting social-emotional competence in infants and young children. I will have a handout on this as well that gives an explanation of the model. After receiving extensive training each classroom will be establishing a “Solution Center” or in our classroom a ‘Relaxing Center’. This is where we keep our Trucker the Turtle and different calming items such as a sensory bottle and soft squishy items. This center is for the children to use to have their own personal space to identify and manage their emotions and learn different techniques on how to handle their difficult situation. Along with all this new structure throughout the classroom, the children will be working on meeting new friends and getting to know them well. I will be handing out an All about me assignment that I would like you to do at home with your child and bring back to school.

Pre-school II

Welcome!

Dear Parents,

My name is Ms. Angie and I will be your child's new teacher in the Preschool II class (green room). I have a BA in Education and a Master of Science in Forensic Science. Your children are growing fast and I, along with Ms. Celeste, look forward to working with you and your child as we teach them to reach for the stars.

Your child is developing in many ways---physically, socially, emotionally, in language, and in thinking (cognitive) skills. We will support your child in all of these areas.

Physical development is the way your child moves her arms and legs (large motor skills) and her fingers and hands (small motor skills). We will help you learn these skills by offering different physical activities and equipment. Children run, jump, climb, throw, and catch. Using their hands, they explore materials like paints, playdough, puzzles, sand, and things to write with. By using their bodies actively both indoors and outdoors, children build healthy bones and muscles.

Social development helps your child have a good relationship with others. We will help your child understand the importance of respecting others and working together. By playing and learning together, children build their social skills, language skills, and self-control. Our teachers will help the children learn to resolve conflicts that may come up during play.

Emotional development lets your child understand his feelings and the feelings of others. We will help the children recognize and manage their own feelings and behavior. We will also teach the children to show concern for others.

Language and literacy development helps your child understand and communicate through listening, talking, reading, and writing. These skills are all connected. We will help your child use her growing communication skills to learn new concepts. We will be covering letter recognition and phonics, numbers, and colors. We will also read books and have many classroom discussions.

Thinking, or cognitive, skills develop as children learn to think more complexly, make decisions, and solve problems. As young children explore, ask questions, and create, they improve their thinking skills. Reflecting on and using information lets your child understand the world around him. The way children approach learning is also an important part of their thinking skills. For example, being able to focus or handle frustration helps him learn more easily. We will work with the children daily to become independent thinkers.

The following items are needed for my class:

- Red and blue mat for nap time.
- Mat cover (king size pillowcase)
- 2 complete changes of clothes (shorts/pants, shirt, underwear, and socks)
- 1 extra pair of shoes

Items that are NOT needed:

- Basket for items (I have provided a plastic tote for your child's items for storage)
- Toys. Please leave toys at home.

Important information about lunch:

- We are a nut-free school
- Candy is not allowed
- Sugary foods are allowed after your child has eaten their healthy growing food.
- The children are provided as much water as they would like to drink at lunch and have access to water all day.

We believe that communication is the key to your child's success and to a great parent/teacher relationship. I encourage you to contact me if you have any questions or concerns at any time.

Welcome September! The Children have done well adjusting to our VPK schedule and classroom rules. The Children are coming in ready to start the day. Please remember to sign your child in and out of class every day. I would like to thank everyone who was able to help provide school supplies. Our Unit this month reflects a review of “All About Me” and “Back to School”. In addition, we will be focusing on the “Fall”, “Apples”, And, “The Five Senses”. Our classroom and School are implementing the book “Character Kids” By: Kristin Ciofalo Illustrated by Brandon Starr. We are using the vocabulary and meanings in the book to model good conduct. The Vocabulary includes key words such as, Cooperative, Kind, Responsible, Honest and Brave. Please talk to your child about the book and the words to help them have a successful year.

For Bible scriptural teachings we will meet with Sister Donna on Tuesdays in the church and she will also assist and teach the children all about cooking. Our Bible curriculum is Discovering Gods world and Bright Beginnings.

For our scholastic learning we are using the creative learning curriculum that supports the Florida Early Learning and Development standards. We will help shape age appropriate activities in all areas of Social, Cognitive, and Physical developments that will be presented in ways that interest the children and encourage them to explore the world around them. We do include in our learning indoor/outdoor art, sand and water play daily. Children should wear comfortable shoes with rubber soles for running and climbing. Snacks are an important part of our children’s day, please remember that when you’re bringing in your monthly snacks that we are a peanut free center.



Families are welcome to visit or have lunch with their child. I am always available for you. You may call me here at Sacred heart or set up a time to meet with me, I am truly here and available for your child and families. I am excited and looking forward to an amazing and rewarding school year!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I am very excited and looking forward to teaching your child and providing meaningful experiences to develop a lifelong learning experience.

My teaching goals are to:

- Create a Positive, Safe, Supportive, Loving, and healthy Learning environment through both direct instruction and independent play, which will foster positive self-esteem and academic growth. This learning environment will be enriched by utilizing Developmentally Appropriate strategies and hands-on exploration to enhance your child's Growth and Development across all developmental domains including Cognitive, Physical, and Socio-Emotional Development
- Prepare Each Child for Kindergarten and Build the Foundation for their Educational Success.
- Develop a sense of wonder, appreciation, and excitement for exploring the world around them.
- Enrich your child's ability to express his/her thoughts verbally and creatively.
- Build positive character traits like kindness, cooperation, courage, honesty, respect, and responsibility which help children to make good choices, develop self-esteem, and become responsible and caring individuals.

To achieve these goals, I look forward to Partnering with You and try to provide:

- The Integration of Catholic Christian Faith and Learning: Emphasizing love and kindness, sharing, caring, friendship, respect, and appreciation of each person and of all God's creation.
- Cognitive activities: Growing and learning in a variety of ways including colors, shapes, matching, opposites, sequencing, sorting, conservation, pre-math, numbers, observing, predicting, interacting, pre-reading, and discovering and experiencing their world.
- Language / Literature Experiences: Expression and learning through sharing, speaking, listening, circle time, Alphabet letter and letter sound, puppets, conversation with adult and peers, games, following directions, stories, nursery rhymes, songs, finger plays and having a Daily Journal.
- Social and Emotional Development Strategy: Fostering Emotional Literacy: Label Children's Feelings, Play Games, Sing Songs, and Read Stories with New Feeling Words. Teaching the Tucker Turtle Technique. The Problem - Solving 4 Steps. Using the Pyramid Model Approach to address Challenging behavior.
Teach Second Step/ Skill Streaming Social Skills. Opportunities for dramatic play, role-play, decision making, sharing, interacting positively as individuals and in a group, good manners, growing and exploring.
- Music& Movement Activities: Songs, musical instruments, dance, rhythm activities, listening.
- Art Activities: Opportunities to create with various mediums: paint, paper, crayons, chalk, clay, playdough, etc.
- Fine Motor Activities: Tactile learning, cutting, pasting, drawing, painting, puzzles, small blocks, manipulative toys, sensory exploration.
- Large Motor Activities: Body movement, jumping, large block building, balancing, and music.
- Language / Literature Experiences: Expression and learning through sharing, speaking, listening, circle time, puppets, conversation with adult and peers, games, following directions, stories, nursery rhymes, songs, and finger plays.
- Technology: The use of classroom Computer to enhance skills and ideas from the week. Use the "Young Explorer" Curriculum, which includes Millie's Math House, Bailey's Book house, Sammy's science House, Thinking Things etc.

On August 12 we begin our VPK School year. We will have VPK from 9a.m and ends at 12p.m.

Our morning Assembly starts at 8:50m. Please try to bring your child in time to attend the Assembly and to fully benefit from all of our scheduled activities.

Please SIGN your child IN and OUT EVERYDAY and have your child sign themselves in on the clipboard. We are required by law to have your signature and time of arrival and departure, every day. We will have our "Who's here today?" cards.

Please LABEL EVERYTHING and please bring a complete change of labeled clothing in a Ziploc bag to keep at school in case of accidents.

We will go outside everyday weather permitting. Please dress your child in non-slip shoes. Flip-Flops and sandals are not safe on the climbing equipment and for running and jumping. And please dress your child in weather appropriate cloths.

We are happy to have Birthday Celebrations in our Classroom throughout the year. Please let me know if you want to bring in a special snack or cupcakes for your Child's Birthday.

Snack time is an important part of our day. Please remember when sending in your monthly snack that we are a PEANUT FREE CENTER. Please check all labels.

Every 4th week we will have a cooking activity with Sr. Donna. A sign-up sheet will be posted on our clipboard for you to provide the ingredients.

Every Tuesday we will go to the Church and listen to Bible Story. During this fellowship, we will learn about God's love from stories out of the Old and New Testaments

We use the Creative Curriculum which supports the FL. Early Learning and Developmental Standards for four-year-old Children.

The first few weeks we will focus on "Welcome/All About Me" Unit. This Unit is to help children learn about each other and each other's families and to realize that every person is unique and special. They also learn that every child's thoughts and ideas are important and no one person is more or less important than another. And this Unit will help them get to know the special and unique things about themselves and each other. They also learn that every child's thoughts and ideas are important and no one person is more or less important than another.

We will talk about Classroom "DO's, and Playground Safety.

Each week we will focus on a Number, Letter, Shape, and Color. We will incorporate this in everything we do.

If this is your child's first experience, it may be hard for you to let them go! It will be well worth it. It is in your child's best interest that we all work together in regard to your child's growth and development of skills. Thus, I will be asking for your support throughout the year.

I cannot wait to see what this year has to offer! Thank you for taking this positive step towards your child's future success! I am very excited about the upcoming year and I look forward to working with both you and your child.

Notes from Cindie

Learning from Mistakes... every one of us has had the opportunity to learn something from a mistake or from a failure. Once you learned something after a failure first you never forgot it. Once you achieved something successfully after failed attempts you had pride that you overcame your obstacle. Life changing discoveries such as penicillin and the "Pacemaker" were created after failures and mistakes.

The Florida Early Learning Standards have developmentally appropriate benchmark goals from birth to kindergarten for problem solving (III.B.1.a) and for managing emotions (III.D.2.a). It is important to let your children "Fail" or "Make Mistakes". The way children learn to overcome adversity is to have to problem solve and try again. If any of you remember the "Magic School Bus" you will remember that Mrs. Frizzle's favorite saying was to "take chances, get messy and make mistakes!"

That is the magic of childhood to make mistakes and learn from them in a safe environment. Our job as parents and teachers is to gently guide, teach and encourage them to try again. It is ok for them to feel frustrated about failing, acknowledge that feeling and teach them how to overcome the frustration and try again. In doing so, you have taught your child how to be successful both in overcoming a hard task and in managing their feelings in an appropriate manner.

It is hard for us as parents and teachers to see a child struggle with a task. We always want to help, but it is more important to teach a child to try when it is hard than to give up and let someone else do it for them. These are lessons that will form your child into a confident, well rounded, successful adult.


